• Post-structuralism emerged in France during the 1960s as a movement critiquing Structuralism.

• In a 1966 lecture titled "Structure, Sign and Play in the Discourse of the Human Sciences", Jacques Derrida presented a thesis on an apparent rupture in intellectual life.

• Derrida interpreted this event as a "decentering" of the former intellectual cosmos. Instead of progress or divergence from an identified centre, Derrida described this "event" as a kind of "play".

• Roland Barthes published "The death of the Author" in which he announced a
